Your Doctor is Board Certified in Psychiatry

Not all doctors are board certified. Ask for the details.


A board certified doctor is committed to participating in lifelong learning that goes beyond completing medical school and obtaining a license to practice medicine.

Board certified doctors meet the highest standards and requirements of a certifying board such as the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology (ABPN) by completing the training and demonstrating the competence necessary to provide quality patient care in his/her medical specialty.

To become certified, a doctor must be a graduate of an accredited medical school, complete all training in an accredited or approved program, have an active, full, unrestricted medical license, complete any specialized training requirements from the ABPN and pass a certification exam.

To remain certified, ABPN board certified doctors need to show **continuous evidence** of:

- An unrestricted medical license in the US or Canada.
- Participation in continuing medical education, self-assessment and patient safety activities.
- Passing a multiple choice exam at least once every 10 years that is relevant to their specialty and passing another exam if they are certified in a subspecialty (doctors can have more than one certification) OR participating in a professional journal article-based assessment activity designed as an alternative to the exam.
- Participation in a quality improvement exercise.

Since 1935, when its first examination was delivered, the ABPN has been serving the public interest and promoting excellence in the practices of psychiatry and neurology through its certification and maintenance of certification processes.
